Unfortunately, few people today know enough about their forefathers to know what their sins were. However, their lives are affected by those sins whether they know about them or not. Christians today have lost this concept. Failure to confess and deal with the sins of the forefathers often results in failure when attempts are made to break inherited curses.

I have a friend with whom I have corresponded for some time. She is a committed Christian, who serves the Lord with her whole heart. A couple of months ago I received a letter from Sandy telling me that she didn't know what was wrong with her physical body but that she was gravely ill. As I read her letter my heart was grieved because the symptoms she described to me fit perfectly that symptoms of cancer of the pancreas.

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"Dwelling In Love"

Genesis 33:1-4

After twenty years, these two brothers meet. Esau had already vowed vengeance after the death of his father. Though his father was yet alive he felt the moment of reckoning had now come. The bitterness of twenty years would now find expres-

sion. If you keep bitterness against anyone for any reason in your heart even for a day, your spiritual system will be poisoned. You may feel fully justified. But the Bible says, "Let not the sun go down on your

wrath." That is God's law. Why can't we keep God's law? Why don't we fear God— because of pride. Why is it difficult to say 'sorry' to a brother or sister? When did we become so perfect that we consider ourselves so infallible?

It is just a proud heart that is willing to forfeit the presence of God. Is that not terrible? Anybody who enjoys the presence of God will say, 'I would not lose the presence of God even at the cost of my life.' When you become spiritually insensitive, various things begin to accumulate in your mind. In a spiritually

insensitive person, a lot of rubbish accumulates. Ill-will, resentment, evil thoughts, some ambitions which are outside God's will- all these things accumulate.

We have learnt not to speak lies. We have learnt not to steal. We have learnt not to use foul language.

We have learnt to give God the tithes and offerings. We have learnt to pray and give God the time that we should. But in weightier matters we are failing. The devil's trick is to disturb us in our relationship with one

another.

Generally, we see tension between in-laws everywhere in the world. Who is a spiritual person? A spiritual person is one who has victory in the relationship with in-laws. Whatever may be the provocation, a spiritual person overcomes. Are we living in perfect peace with one another?

Life does not consist of smooth and easy situations. Generally, we come across some smart person like Jacob to provoke us. He outwits you. How do you react towards such a per-

I called her immediately. She told me that she had just been to see her doctor that day to get the results of an abdominal CAT scan. He told her that the scan showed what appeared to be a large tumor in her pancreas which was most likely malignant. She was scheduled to be admitted to the hospital the next day for surgery to biopsy the tumor to determine if it indeed was cancer. People with pancreatic cancer at that stage usually live only three to six months after receiving the diagnosis. There are no known effective treatments for this condition.

I asked Sandy if she knew for certain if it was God's will for her to live or die. She replied, "I have been asking the Lord this very question. But, to be honest, I have so much pain, and my emotions are so involved- especially with my husband's terrible worry and grief- that I haven't been able to hear the Lord's answer clearly. However, deep inside, I just have this feeling that my work for Him isn't finished yet."

My response was, "Sandy, the Lord knows your heart. He knows that you want to do His will. You can rest in that. If you don't have a clear answer from God that it is His will to take you Home now, then I believe you should resist death with all your might."

Sandy answered, "You know, Rebecca, I have known for years that there is a curse of cancer on my family. As far back as I can trace, every member of my family has died from cancer at a fairly young age. Usually the cancer has been of the liver or pancreas. I thought I had broken the curse off my own life, but now it looks like I have not been successful in doing so. I don't understand why. I should have the power in Christ to break it."

I asked Sandy if she knew the origin of the curse. She replied, "No, I don't. I have tried my best to find out but haven't been able to. I just know that the Lord showed me it is a curse and that it affects my whole family line."

The Holy Spirit had just been teaching my husband and me the importance of the principle of confessing the sins of the forefathers. I shared this information with Sandy, especially the passage in Leviticus 26. I felt that since the cancer curse was an inherited one, most likely Satan had the legal right to curse her family because of the sins of her forefathers.

"But what if you don't know all the sins?" She asked. "I do know that my family has an extensive history of sexual immorality and divorce. In fact, I am the first one to remain in a marriage, and that's because I accepted Christ. Very few in my family ever became Christians."

I told Sandy that I thought she should get on her knees before the Lord and confess all the sins of her forefathers that she did know about and also ask Him to forgive those she didn't know about. She needed to ask the Lord to separate her completely from all the sins of her forefathers by the precious blood of Jesus. Next, she should ask the Lord to remove the curse if it was from Him. Only then would she be ready to deal with Satan. After she confessed the sins of her forefathers. Satan would no longer have a legal right to continue the curse of cancer in her life or in the lives of her descendants. She was to command the curse of cancer to be broken in the name of Jesus Christ.

I further suggested that she and her husband join together and anoint her with oil, covering her whole epigastric area and the area of her pain with the oil. While they applied the oil, she should command all demons associated with the curse to leave her at once in the name of Jesus. I also suggested that she specifically command any demon afflicting her pancreas or causing the tumor to leave at once in Jesus' name. Finally, she needed to ask the Lord to heal all the damage that had been done.

Sandy did all this that night.

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When she was taken to surgery the next day, the doctors could not find any trace of tumor they had seen on the CAT scan! They found some enlargement of her pancreas from inflammation, but nothing else was wrong. Praise the Lord!

"Raise Your Praise"

"Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare his works with rejoicing" (Psalm 107:22)

This is a psalm of praise. Thanksgiving is like offering sacrifice to God. We often fail in giving thanks because we are not Godconscious. We depend upon our self-effort and we also pray. When we receive what we ask in prayer, we congratulate ourselves. This is not of faith.

Religion is more of self-effort and less of experiencing God at work. People have put religion into physical actions like pilgrimages and social work. The man who does these works is pleased with himself. There is nothing to praise God in all this. But Christian work is just the opposite of this. You cannot get praise or merit in the presence of God by your efforts. By their own efforts, some Christians

try to merit salvation and build up credits with God. Even obeying His word is possible only with the help of God. No man can obey the Word of God as God

wants him to, without God's help. God's standards are so high that we by ourselves cannot please Him.

There is nothing in us that can merit God's mercy. Man is sinful from head to foot. "Lord I bring these offerings to you," says man. He does not stop to see with what hands and what heart he is bringing those offerings. God notices that he is coming with hands full of blood and a heart desperately wicked. "As it is written, there is none righteous, no, not one: There is none that understandeth, there is none that seeketh after God. They are together become unprofitable: there is none that doeth good, no, not one. Their throat is an open sepulchre; with their tongues they have used deceit; the poison of asps is under their lips: Whose mouth is full of cursing and bitterness" (Romans 3:10-14). Such men we are.

We may bring into an operation theatre a beautiful scarf. But will the doctor accept it to dress the wound? Doctors are very careful not to accept anything that is not sterilized. You may say it had a thorough wash in good soap powder. But he will tell you that both

you and your washed scarf are not clean enough for the operation theatre. How are we with God? Our best righteousness is as filthy rags. That is God's estimate of our best righteousness. Unless a man accepts that, he can never obtain mercy. He must accept that the motives behind his best actions are selfish. He needs to be cleansed at the foot of the cross. Saul of Tarsus who was blameless according to the law had to be cleansed at the foot of the cross. There he saw how much Jesus suffered to cleanse him from his sin and sinfulness.

We conducted revival meetings and we prayed that people's eyes may be opened. There was a man who would not accept that he was a sinner. In a day when the Spirit of repentance came on the people, this man was weeping very

son? Esau was a very imperfect man and so disobedient as to be rejected by God. But in this situation, it is amazing how well he fares! He kissed his brother and almost behaved like the father of the prodigal son. Forgiving words came out of this man's heart.

"No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us." (1 John 4:12). I want everybody who enters our places of worship to feel the atmosphere of God's love. "God dwelleth in us." How do we know that? By the positive love we have one toward another. This love does not crack down when rebuked. No, it is a steady flow. Can you stop a river? What massive barrages have to be built to interrupt the flow of a river? Sometimes even those are swept away. The river of God's love should not be dammed off by anyone of us. It would be very wrong. Yet it is possible. The devil wants just that. Suppose water does not go through a particular canal or channel, what happens? A whole area suffers. They just cannot have a harvest. Is the flow of love interrupted by you? Examine your heart.

The Lord Jesus gave us a very simple rule. "... if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath aught against thee; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift." (Matt.5:23,24). I have asked pardon of some brothers, not once, or twice or thrice but four times. I am convinced that I am not wrong. Something from me has managed to hurt him. So I will say, "sorry" and say it again and again, if necessary. I do not want that river of love to stop from my heart. I do not want to lose the

presence of God. Be very careful, dear people.

If you want to dwell in God, you should dwell in love. If you do not dwell in love, you are not dwelling in God. You are dwelling in an organization, and are not dwelling in God: what a dangerous thing that is! When you do not dwell in God, no good work comes out of you, only evil- only evil words, evil thoughts, evil reactions, evil deeds, poison and pollution will come out of you. But, if you dwell in God you dwell in love.

Where are you? Are you at least in Esau's state to forgive and love a brother who has injured you? When Isaac died, both Esau and Jacob buried him together. Are we at that place where we are sanctified and made ready for such reconciliation? We should humble ourselves and examine our hearts and see that we do not stop revival.
